KNOWN FOR ITS POOL PARTIES AND 'TOWIE' BLING, OK! UNCOVERS MARBELLA'S MORE REFINED SIDE



itting on Spain's southern coastline,
Marbella has long been a celebrity
hotspot. Facing the Mediterranean
Sea and backed by the Sierra Blanca
mountain range, Marbella is renowned for its glitz
and glarmour, with the yacht-packed marina in
Puerto Banus the summer epicentre for WAGs
and reality TV stars alike, if, however, you want
a more authentic slice of Spain, you'll discover
enchanting cobbled streets, whitewashed houses
and pretty piazzas in Marbella's picturesque Old
Town. OKI's Alex Hurst flew out and discovered
that Marbella is definitely a town of two halves.

WHICH STARS WILL I SEE?

Last month, Eva Longoria Bastón was in Marbella to attend the Global Gift Gala at the Gran Meliá Don Pepe resort. She rubbed shoulders with the likes of Vogue Williams and Spencer Matthews at the party and was spotted soaking up the sun on the beach with her husband Jose Antonio Bastón. Gwyneth Paltrow is another Hollywood star who's been in Marbella recently. She was seen strolling around town with her son Moses during a family break. Craig David has just performed in Marbella and will be back for another gig on August 25 at Aqwa Mist, while The Pretenders. Anastacia and the Gipsy Kings will all be performing at the Starlite Festival Marbella lat runs until Lausust 26.

WHERE CAN I STAY?

If you want to dip into both sides of Marbella, check into the Amère Marbella Beach Hotel,



perfectly located on the beach front, just a short stroll from the Old Town and less than 10km from Puerto Banus. Reopening this year after

an extensive facelift the adult-only hotel sees stylish new guest rooms and a revitalised spa and beach club. Taking inspiration from the sea, you'll find turquoise splashes running throughout the all-white hotel – from the bedroom cushions to the hotel bikes. The

236-room hote has a contemporary design, with funky light fixtures and floor-to-ceiling windows in the lobby taking full advantage of the ocean views. There are five room categories, with O/RI staying in a toprated O/L å Lå The One room, an airy space with a cool geometric white-wood headboard. Nespresso machine and a sea-facing balcony. An added bonus of booking this room type is access to the exclusive The One service, which includes unlimited drinks and sancks in a private lounge and use of the spa's hydrotherapy circuit.

WHAT CAN I DO?

During the day, guests can recover from the night before on the double sun loungers next to the palm tree-shaded pool or on the beach in front of the boho-chic beach club, listening to themed music sessions from the resident Dis. If you've overdone the sun, head indoors to the hottle's Spa By Germaine de Capuccini, a calming space with muted colours and flickening fragrant candles. OKI signed up for the Kirel Sublime, a relaxing Japanese-inspired facial, and then made use of the spa's hydrotherapy circuit.

For an early evening aperitif, watch the sun set at the hotel's Belvue Rooftop Bar, a

our stay, OK! tried a few cocktalls but our favourite was the Marbella, a delicious concoction of rum, caramel vodka, Malibu, coconut and mango, which smelt as good as it tasted!

WHERE CAN I EAT?

Freshly-cooked pancakes or eggs Benedict, cooked to order at the hotel's Mare Nostrum restaurant, was the perfect way for OKI to start.

the day. The hotel has an array of restaurants, with the Michelin-starred Messina at the top end. Here, OKI enjoyed grilled sardines, a succulent steak and the Spanish speciality bizcochos borrachos, a sponge cake soaked in local sweet dessert wine. For

a laid-back vibe, dine at the hotel's funky Amàre Lounge, a restaurant that spills out on the pool area, and take in one of the nightly shows. While we ate our Caesar salad, exquisitely laid out in a flower shape, we listened to the il Divo tribute band.

Just a pleasant stroll from the botel takes you to the newly revamped Soleo Marbella Beach Club, located in the grounds of the Hotel Fuerte Marbella (www.soleomarbella.com). Take a pew on one of the red and white striped banquettes on the sea-

facing terrace and order a portion of crispy seafood served in a newspaper cone. Menu highlights include the grilled fish on skewers and El Fuerte's paella, which OK! enjoyed with a couple of glasses of sangria.

WHERE CAN I SHOP?

With Puerto Banus offering all the designer

names and the stores in Marbella's Old Town selling hand-crafted leather goods, ceramics and jewellery, you'll be spollt for choice. If you prefer to shop under one roof, make a beeline to El Cortes Inglés in Puerto Banus, a six-storey fashion emporium where you'll find more designer labels, as well as a food hall and champagne bar. If you have limited time,

sign up for their personal shopper experience (we were told that Antonio Banderas has). We received top tips on how to judge what style and colours suit our complexion and body shape and were advised that top Spanish brands Desigual, Intropia and Birmba y Lola would be ideal. If only we had a celebrity budget to match!

WHICH SIGHTS MUST I SEE?

Marbella's enchanting Old Town is a must visit. Lose yourself in the maze of cobbled streets that radiate off the main Plaza de los Naranios,





named after the square's fragrant orange blossom trees. Stop at one of the outdoor cafés and sip a coffee, try a churro dipped in chocolate or some early evening tapas while listening to the trickling waters of the fountain.

Hop on one of the hotel bikes and cycle along the pedestrianised seafront promenade to Puerto Banus, stopping off at the cafés or shops along the way. With blue skies, solden beaches and sea views,

it's the perfect way to enjoy the scenery and people watch. Just watch out for the constant parade of joggers, dog walkers and
